**In the event of a strike**, all members must participate in strike activity to be eligible for strike assistance. Per the Guidelines of the International Union, your strike activity will be assigned to you by the Local Union Strike Committee. **IT IS YOUR OBLIGATION TO REPORT TO UAW LOCAL 1250 ON THE DAYS ASSIGNED BELOW.** Participation in the Strike may be picket duty, strike information class, or any other strike related assignment. You must be a member in good standing as dictated by the International Constitution.

To qualify for your first strike assistance, you must report to the UAW Local 1250 Union Hall according to the chart below where you will be given instructions concerning registration and picket duty:

**You MUST PERFORM YOUR STRIKE ASSIGNMENT for your MEDICAL COVERAGE to be PAID and to receive your Strike Assistance.** If you fail to register during the first week of the strike, you will not qualify for your first strike benefit. Strike Pay is \$500.00 per week before taxes.

Receipt of pensions, survivor benefits, social security, or vacation pay, shall not affect the eligibility of the member who is entitled to Strike Assistance.

## NO ONE CAN REGISTER FOR YOU!

**(OVER)**

**\*PLEASE NOTE: You will personally be required to input the following information when you self-register on the online strike portal**

- Yours, Spouse and All Dependents Social Security Numbers
- Date of Birth
- Address
- Telephone number
- Personal Email
- Your dependent’s date of birth

**If you choose not to provide the required information listed above, you will not be entitled to Strike Assistance (Pay), Medical or the Right to Picket.**

You must sign in with your picket captain when reporting for picket duty, and you must present your picket card at strike headquarters (Local 1250 Union Hall) to receive your strike assistance benefits. **DO NOT LOSE YOUR PICKET CARD. YOU MUST HAVE IT IN ORDER TO RECEIVE STRIKE ASSISTANCE.** Please retain this notice for your records and future reference.

**INSURANCE BENEFITS**

Upon approval by the International President and Secretary-Treasurer, the International Union will pay from its Strike Fund: Basic Group Life of \$50,000 maximum, Transition Bridge, and Medical-Assistance including doctor, hospital, prescriptions, and Cobra options but will exclude the following: dental, vision, audio and sick and accident for striking members who participate in a strike activity assigned by the local union.

*Optional insurance coverage and rider policies will remain the responsibility of the member.*

**NOTE:**

As the contract deadline approaches, we cannot tell you there will not be a strike. We continue to work diligently to avoid this type of drastic measure, but we need to see some serious movement from the Company soon. We understand that our active and retired members must and will be protected. In the event we DO NOT strike nationally, it is still possible to go on strike locally. The Company is moving slowly on some major concerns. Your Bargaining Committee remains committed to getting the best possible contract, with that said we should all remain cautiously optimistic.

We recognize there is speculation from those who are not involved in the negotiations, remember they are simply expressing their opinion, we need to disregard these rumors and reserve your final judgement once a tentative agreement is reached both nationally and locally.

*Reminder: we are also asking for any nonperishable food items and or toiletries that you are willing to donate, please bring non-expired items to the Union Hall for us to store. These items will be shared with UAW members that may have a need should we strike. If not needed, the food items will be donated to a local shelter. We know we can always count on our UAW brothers and sisters to help and bless those in need.*
